



Training Standards for Collision Repair in Ogden, UT

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Modern vehicle manufacturing involves a growing range of materials, electronic components, and safety technologies that can affect how collision damage is evaluated and repaired. High-strength steel, aluminum panels, cameras, radar systems, and other advanced driver assistance components may require vehicle-specific procedures following an accident. As automotive technology continues to change, collision repair professionals may need ongoing education to remain familiar with current repair methods and manufacturer information. Young Collision Center recently completed its 2026 annual training requirements to maintain its I-CAR Gold Class recognition. The program focuses on role-based education and continuing coursework for collision repair professionals. I-CAR Gold Class recognition is based on facility-level training requirements across multiple collision repair roles. The program includes educational requirements for areas such as estimating, non-structural repair, structural repair, and refinishing. To maintain recognition, participating facilities must continue meeting applicable training requirements over time. Individual technicians may also pursue and maintain I-CAR Platinum designations through role-specific coursework and continuing education. These training programs address evolving vehicle technologies, repair procedures, and industry practices. Ongoing education can

help collision repair professionals remain familiar with changes in materials, electronic systems, and manufacturer information that may affect how specific vehicles are evaluated and repaired after an accident.

The training framework also reflects the fact that collision repairs can involve different procedures depending on the vehicle, the location of the damage, and the systems affected. Technicians may need to review manufacturer repair information when determining repair methods, component replacement requirements, sensor positioning, or other aspects of the work. Current documentation can provide guidance on issues such as approved weld locations, sectioning procedures, material handling, and the steps associated with particular vehicle systems. Continuing education is one way repair professionals can remain familiar with changes to these procedures as new vehicle models enter the market.

Today's vehicles may require specialized processes when repairs involve aluminum, high-strength steel, or other materials with manufacturer-specific handling requirements. Advanced driver assistance systems can also add another layer to the repair process. Depending on the vehicle and the work performed, cameras, radar, sensors, and related components may need inspection, initialization, or recalibration according to manufacturer procedures. Even damage that appears limited to one area of a vehicle can affect components or systems located elsewhere.

As a result, collision repair in Ogden, UT, may involve a combination of diagnostics, structural repair, cosmetic work, refinishing, and electronic procedures. The specific services required can vary based on the vehicle's design and the nature of the collision. Ongoing training may address developments in hybrid and electric vehicle systems, structural adhesives, panel bonding methods, electronic diagnostics, and other technologies used in newer vehicles. Repair professionals may also need to stay informed about updates to manufacturer documentation and changes to recommended repair processes.
